Inspiring artists

GLOW

Lily van der Stokker

Lily van der Stokker creates cheerful art with lots of colors, flowers, and funny texts like "I'm going to bed" or "Ugly!". She paints ordinary things from daily life, like a couch or a teapot, and turns them into something special. Her art sometimes looks childish or silly, but she wants to show that soft and sweet things matter too. She believes the art world often only listens to serious men. With her work, she says: girly things deserve a place too!



Henk Visch

Henk Visch is an artist from Eindhoven who creates sculptures of people and animals, often with long arms or unusual poses. His art sometimes looks a bit strange or funny, but it always makes you think. He works with metal, wood, and other materials, crafting pieces that seem to move or dream. Visch wants his sculptures to express feelings and thoughts, without always offering one clear answer. His art raises questions—and that's exactly what he finds beautiful.

Design your dream artwork

Tips for your design

- Location in your dream city
- Materials and shapes
- How will you involve local residents?
- Use colored pencils, markers, fineliners
- Add details and color to your dream cloud
- Let yourself be inspired by the artists



Let's get started!



What do you need?

- A printed dream cloud on A4 paper
- Colored pencils, markers, and a black fineliner or thin marker



Sketch with pencil

Draw inside the dream cloud with a pencil what you dream about or imagine. You don't need to work neatly yet—this is the moment to experiment and discover what you enjoy.

Let's get started!



Satisfied? Time to add color!

Are you happy with your drawing? Then it's time to color it in. Use bright, vibrant colors so your artwork really stands out.



Color the background too

Don't just focus on your artwork—give the background a beautiful color as well. That way, it becomes a complete piece of art.

Let's get started!



Create contrast with black

When you're done coloring, you can trace the main lines with a black fineliner or thin marker. This adds more contrast and makes your drawing look stronger.



Finished? Show it off!

Is everything done? Then your dream artwork is ready to be shared. Well done!
